Florida

Florida Keys' Lime Pie Nothing says Florida Keys

like some Key Lime Pie. Get tropical with dessert with this yummy recipe!

8 oz. Graham crackers, crushed into fine crumbs

4 oz. butter, melted

8 oz. cream cheese

6 oz. sweetened condensed

grated rind and juice of 2

10 fl. oz. double cream Mix together cracker crumbs and melted butter. Press into a lightly greased 9-inch loose bottomed flan tin. Chill until

Beat the cream cheese and condensed milk until smooth.

Beat in the grated lime rind and 6 Tbs. lime juice. Whip cream into soft peaks, then fold into the cream cheese mixture.

Spoon into crumb shell. Chill for 1 hour and serve.

Georgia Peach and Praline Pie

This Georgia peach and praline pie recipe combines two great pies in one pie shell.

1 unbaked 9-inch pie shell

3 Tbsp. flour

1/2 c. white sugar 4-1/2 c. peeled and sliced

1-1/2 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice

1/3 c. brown sugar

1/4 c. flour

1/2 c. chopped pecans 3 Tbsp. butter

Combine 3 tablespoons flour and white sugar in large bowl; add peaches and lemon juice.

In another bowl, combine brown sugar, 1/4 cup flour and pecans. Cut in butter until

Sprinkle 1/3 pecan mixture over bottom of pie shell, cover with peach mixture. Sprinkle remaining pecan mixture over peaches.

Bake at 375 degrees for 40

minutes or until peaches are ten-

Hawaii Hawaiian Pork

Curry powder and pineapple juice make this a uniquely flavored dish.

2 lb. lean pork loin, well

trimmed 1/3 c. lemon juice

2 Tbsp. vegetable oil 2 Tbsp. shredded onion

1/4 tsp. garlic powder

1/4 tsp. salt 1 tsp. ginger

1-1/2 tsp. curry powder 1/2 c. pineapple juice

Place pork loin in a shallow pan. Combine remaining ingredients and pour over loin. Cover and marinate in the refrigerator

24 hours. Broil or grill the loin for 15-20 minutes on each side, placing meat 4-6 inches from heat element. Pork is done when an internal temperature of 170 degrees is reached. Baste with


